Where tools are used here, they are used for the mechanical parts of production and not for the substance:

Research assistance to locate stories, articles, and sources, followed by checking who wrote a source, when it was written, and where it came from.

Grammar checking, proofreading, and consistency passes on text that was already written.

Audio cleanup in podcast production, such as reducing noise and pops.

Accessibility, formatting, and search optimization tasks.

Transcription of recorded audio, reviewed against the recording.

A tool that checks spelling does not write the argument. A tool that finds an article does not decide whether the article is credible. Those decisions stay with the person whose name is on the work.
